


I am very happy and pleased to offer the first part of my British Commonwealth charity sale for countries Australia to Gibraltar.

My interest in Commonwealth notes can be traced back to my days as a young man travelling to England for several months. I was exposed to the incredible varieties of British notes all over the world, beginning in the days of the Empire up to the recent times of the Commonwealth.

In later years and as a professional design architect, I was fascinated by the richness of designs and colours which were often chosen according to the place the banknotes were intended for, whether it was Africa, the Caribbean, or some exotic island. One of the things I was amazed by was the large number of the monarchs' portraits starting with King George V and to the current Queen Elizabeth II with over 30 varieties of portraits on the banknotes. As Peter Symes described in his research dedicated to QEII banknotes, the varieties of portraits on the banknotes are due, in the main, to different engravers - but there are some varieties due to different photographs from a photographic session being selected by different printers or issuing authorities.

From the classic early King George V to the recent Bank of England polymer notes I always aspired to collect each and every possible note related to the subject, pursuing classic rarities, unadopted



Over the years I was fortune enough to get the opportunity to enhance my Commonwealth collection via major auction sales such as 'Banknotes of Bermuda', the David J. Saul Collection. Dr. Saul (who sadly passed away in May 2017) was Bermuda's former Premier and a real gentleman; I was privileged to meet him in person at Spink and to acquire many of his rare notes.





Another major source was the British Commonwealth collection of my dear friend Bruce Smart, as well as the collection of Laurence Pope; I am also in debt to the latter for his kind help in preparing this catalogue.

This catalogue was specially designed in order to serve as a source of knowledge for future generations, as well as to derive enjoyment simply from reading it.

The decision to sell such a fabulous collection has not been taken lightly, but I am happy to give this opportunity to new players in the field. I wish the bidders success and may all my banknotes find good homes. I am very confident that each of the banknotes offered here cannot fail to enhance any Commonwealth collection.



WWII EMERGENCY FRACTIONAL ISSUE

In the early months of 1939 the Bermuda Government had authorised the printing of fractional currency notes as economic defense measures for use in emergency only. The Government's concern was that if war will take place it could lead to crisis and hoarding of metal by the public. That was not an unusual step and it had been done by quite few countries as an emergency act (refer to Cyprus for similar example).

The notes were of 1/- and 2/6, uniface with no signature, dated 1st March 1939, the dated they were approved. Their use was restricted up to forty shillings (£2).

On 24th August 1939 a Currency Act was published approving the issue of these notes.


According to shipment data 200,000 1/- notes in a total value of £15,000 and 240,000 2/6 notes in a total value of £30,000 were printed. Altogether, a total of 440,000 fractional notes with a total value of £45,000 were printed.

The coinage shortage never materialized and the notes were destroyed. It is believed approximately eleven specimen sets survived.



Colonial Treasurer Robert Alsop Kelly and his notes

Specimen notes signed by the Colonial Treasurer Robert Alsop Kelly, never issued into general circulation, were discovered in 2000 by Mel Steinberg (RIP); they were acquired by the late Dr. David Saul. Nelson Aspen (RIP), learned about these notes immediately after publishing his book *A History of Bermuda and its Paper Money (2nd Edition)* that same year. In 2013 the notes were auctioned for the first time ever by Spink as part of the Dr. David Saul (Banknotes of Bermuda - Dr. the Hon. David J. Saul Collection, sale no.13047, October 2013).

The notes are of 10/- and £1, and dated 1st April 1943, an unfamiliar date in the Bermudan series with the never issued signature of Colonial Treasurer R.A. Kelly.

The three gentlemen mentioned above started a query to learn more about the notes and the circumstances of printing and later that year, an article by Nelson Page was published in the IBNS (Vol.39-2, pp.39-40).

In 1943 upon the departure of the Colonial Treasurer John T. Trimingham due to his Alzheimer illness, the Assistant Colonial Treasurer Gerald Leroy Young expected his promotion to replace Trimingham. Most unfortunate for him, the political claimant was against him and THUS ON 1ST January 1943; the Bermuda Government appointed 55 years old retired Treasurer of The Gold Coast, R.A. Kelly to the position of Bermuda Colonial Treasurer (The Royal Gazette, Bermuda, Volume 22, Issue No. 248, 22 October 1942).

Nelson writes in his article in the IBNS that Kelly returned to London and giving his resume up to the year 1942 only, while Saul's information as described in his collection auction catalogue was that Kelly died and the notes were scrapped.

A research conducted by Raphael Dabbah Dvir revealed that on 14th November 1945 Kelly's son, Eugene Kelly, a yachtsman, had pass away, and his funeral took place on 5 December (The Royal Gazette, Bermuda). It might be that due to this sad event Kelly had retired and perhaps returned to England with his family.

The fact remains that these notes were never issued into general circulation.

THE 1914 EMERGENCY ISSUE

Shortly after the outbreak of World War I in August 1914, hoarding of British gold sovereigns and Cypriot silver coins was widespread, seriously impeding normal, smaller payments. Moreover, the regular supply of currency from Great Britain was interrupted. With no fresh supply and to ensure a proper existence of cash means, the Cypriot government needed to introduce paper money instead.


On 7 September 1914 the High Commissioner, Sir Hamilton John Goold-Adams, issued a proclamation in which he appointed two Currency Commissioners (the Treasurer of the Island and Chief Assistant Secretary for the Government) and authorized the issuance of £1 and £5 currency notes as legal tender in accordance with the Cyprus Coinage Order of 1900; the notes were printed locally.

Due to the unsatisfactory quality of the local printing, the Cyprus Government commissioned Thomas De La Rue (TDLR) to print new currency notes of 5 shillings, 10 shillings, £1, and £5, all depicting the common profile effigy of KGV in an ornamental frame, all uniface. They were prepared in great haste and this resulted in a very poor design. The notes were given legal status by a proclamation published on 2 December 1914 and locally-printed notes were demonetized on 17 December 1914. On 25 June 1915, the KGV emergency issue was proclaimed to cease to be legal tender as of 30 June; yet due to demands of the Treasury and the local Ottoman Bank, they regained their status on 2 September 1915 and remained such until 1922.

All notes of the series were initially issued with the dates 30 October 1914 and 6 November 1914; the £5 note was issued with additional date, 1 September 1916.

THE 1942 PROVISIONAL AND 1943 EMERGENCY ISSUES

By 1942, the ongoing war interrupted the supply of fresh currency notes from Britain to the island, while local reserves quickly dwindled. In order to bridge the gap between public supply and reserves, the Government of Cyprus had to borrow £250,000 from the Government of Palestine in Palestine Currency Board notes (the £P was on par with £Cy and pound sterling). During May 1942 the army was paid by the Ottoman Bank in a payment which included PCB notes and the latter were used in military camps - but not throughout the island. New shipments of Government of Cyprus notes arrived in September 1942 and the Palestine Currency Board notes were quickly withdrawn and demonetized.

In a situation reminiscent of the American Civil War, low-denomination coins disappeared from circulation and both unissued postage stamps and private scrip were used to fill the breach. In October 1942 this situation was made even more acute when a shipment of 1942 dated piastre and half-piastre coins was lost to due to enemy action en-route to the island. A replacement shipment did not reach Cyprus until May 1943. In order to partially address the need, it was decided to issue a 3 piastres note. Several approaches were taken.

The overprinting of 1/- note:

The first was to over stamp 1/- notes with the 3 piastres value. The notes used for that purpose were 1/- dated 1941 as their stock was relatively high. The overprinting was made by the Government Printing Office and the notes were given the status of legal currency on 16 February 1942. Since the 1/- note had a face value greater than 3 piastres (9 piastres), a great many of these notes had the overprint chemically removed. Due to that, in a matter of few days the government decided to recall all the notes.

The cutting and overprinting of the provisional 3 piastres-1/- note:

The next approach was to cut all the above provisional overprinted 1/- notes into two unequal pieces: 2/5 of the right side and 3/5 of the left side, the latter of which included the king's effigy. The larger portion (left side of the note) was destroyed and the smaller portion, which already had an overprint of '3' on the obverse was overstamped on the reverse with wording of value in three languages and the date 1st March 1943. They were given legal status on 25 February 1943. The total quantity released is not known. The problem with the second approach was that it wasted stocks of notes with a useful face value.

The new 3 piastres note:

Finally, 2,000,000 properly printed 3 piastres were ordered in 1943, but were not received until March 1944. The note was issued with four different dates of which only the first two were released into general circulation. The Type III King's portrait was used - solely for that issue. In fact, the issue of this denomination in paper was its' only occurrence due to the circumstances of wartime and never repeated again. The general engraving was relatively poor.

THE POST KING'S DEATH 1952-54 ISSUES

On 13 December 1951, the Commissioner of Currency (Account Manager), S. M. Rich, dispatched a request to the Crown Agent to prepare new specimens of 5/-, 10/-, £1, and £5 for the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies. The new specimens were to have, for the first time, Latin Turkish characters rather than the Arabic Turkish characters, as approved by the Secretary of State on 1 December 1951. Shortly after that, an order of new type 1 million notes of 5/- was placed; it was decided that the notes would carry the date of 1st September 1952.

However, following the death of King George VI in February 1952 and after exchanging telegrams between the Account Manager and the Crown Agents, things took a different path. It was agreed that the printing company, 'Bradbury Wilkinson & Co.' would print 500,000 notes depicting the portrait of King George VI as approved in late 1951/early 1952, yet the date was to be changed to one prior to the King's passing away, hence 1st February 1952. The remaining 500,000 notes were to be printed with the portrait of Queen Elizabeth II, bearing the date 1st September 1952.

Furthermore, by that time a special Currency Committee appointed by the Government concerning the change of the monetary system was ongoing. It concluded its discussions in August 1953, with recommendations to adopt a decimal monetary system, in which the pound is divided to 1,000 mils. Yet the need for a fresh currency supply was urgent and the alteration of the existing plates by Thomas De La Rue to new ones depicting the portrait of QEII would be expensive. Because of that, in the meantime it was decided that KGVI's currency notes would be reprinted bearing current dates. 10/- and £5 notes were approved in August/September 1953 with a second print of both approved in August 1954. The 10/- dated 1953 was released into general circulation while the 1954 type was released in small quantities; the 1953 £5 notes were printed and delivered to the island, but were never actually released into general circulation and were to be destroyed. The 1954 type is known only in printer's specimen type and none were ever printed. The decimal currency was introduced on 1 August 1955.





THE 1952 5/-

As detailed in the previous section, following the death of King George VI 'Bradbury Wilkinson & Co.' executed an order of the Government of Cyprus to print 1 million 5/- notes. From this total, 500,000 notes were printed with the portrait of King George VI carrying a date prior to the King's passing away, 1st February 1952, while the remaining 500,000 notes were printed with the portrait of Queen Elizabeth II, bearing the date 1st September 1952.

The 5/- note depicting the portrait of the Queen was introduced towards the end of 1952/early 1953. Its design was identical to previous 5/- issues: general abstract ornate patterns with a portrait of the Queen facing to the right in the middle of the obverse side, bearing the same signature of the Commissioner of Currency, S. M. Rich.

This early portrait of the Queen is believed to have been adapted from one of the photographs of Her Majesty by photographer Dorothy Wilding, taken slightly earlier than or shortly after the death of her father.

It was the only note issued under the old monetary system, prior to the introduction of the decimal system.









THE 1955 TYPE SERIES

In August 1953, a special Currency Committee appointed by the Government concluded its discussions with recommendations to adopt a decimal monetary system, in which the pound was divided into 1,000 mils. The new pound and mil system became effective on 1 August 1955. The currency notes composed of four denominations (as described above) and were issued with dates ranging from 1955 to 1960, as will be elaborated. The design of the notes was quite uniform, bearing the Queen's portrait on the right-hand side of the obverse and the geographical outline of Cyprus; the reverse side included the Emblem of Cyprus on the right-hand side.

The portrait of Her Majesty was based on a 1952 photograph taken by photographer Dorothy Wilding. The portrait type is usually referred to in studies as Portrait 4a; it is the most common variety of this portrait as the engraving prepared for the notes printed by Bradbury Wilkinson and Company. This variety of the portrait is distinguished by the heavy shading on Her Majesty's right cheek and the tilt of her head.

Following the establishment of the Central Bank of Cyprus and under its Law of 1963, Section 25, the colonial issue ceased to be legal tender. On 25 September 1964 the Governor of Central Bank of Cyprus issued an Order declaring the demonetization of all colonial issues as of 31 March 1965.

THE 1955 PRESENTATION NOTES

The 1955 series was printed to be presentation notes, specimen notes printed in different colours from the circulation notes, intended to promote sales and presentations. The notes bear no serial numbers, signatures, or dates.







THE 1957 £1 NOTE

As it can be concluded from close study of the printer's consignment specimens that survive today, the 1957 issue was printed in range of six prefixes (A/21 to A/26), each in a quantity of 250,000 notes and totalling 1.5 million notes. It can be assumed that this large-scale printing was made based on the high demand experience of the 1955 and 1956 issues. Yet none of these were ever placed into circulation, probably due to sufficient notes in circulation as well as the move towards the establishment of the Republic. Thus, the Treasury instructed the destruction by burning of the 1957 issue. Members of the Board Committee that attended the burning of the notes kept a small number of notes as souvenirs though it is known that a few of the Committee actually used the kept notes for normal transactions and by that action put them in general circulation. The known notes to survive are all of prefix A/21 - some with consecutive serial numbers and others random serial numbers - indicating that they were taken from different parts of the bundle. It is estimated that no more than 15 of them exist today.

THE 1960 DATED NOTES

Two denominations of the 1955 series were printed with the date 1st March 1960; the 250 mils note and the £5 note. Their story reflects the historical events that occurred towards the establishment of the Republic of Cyprus. Unlike previous issues these two notes carry for, the first time ever, the signature of a Cypriot Commissioner of Currency (Account Manager) C.C. Stephanie, instead of a British signature.

On 16 August 1960, Cyprus proclaimed its independence following the Zürich and London Agreement of 11-19 February 1959 between the United Kingdom, Greece and Turkey. During these 18 months between 1959 and 1960 a transition process began and, among others, the subjects of currency and monetary administration were given thought. Hence the Cypriot official C.C. Stephanie, who held the position of Deputy Account Manager, was appointed as Commissioner of Currency (Account Manager), replacing his British former.

In the meantime the demand for fresh currency arose, especially for the lowest denomination of 250 mils which was in intensive use. Realizing that the process of preparing new currency for the post-independency era could take a while, an order for new 250 mils currency notes was presented. These considerations proved to be correct as the first issue of currency notes under the Republic of Cyprus, dated 1961, were released to general circulation only in August 1962. As it is known today, over 50% of the 1960 250 mils notes were released into general circulation and the rest were destroyed.

In the case of the £5 note the background is quite different. Even though there were still sufficient 1958 £5 notes in the Treasury reserves Cypriot officials were concerned, speculating that this particular denomination could be in demand during the provisional period towards and immediately after the proclamation of Independence due to possible economic uncertainty. Hence, an order for new dated 1960 notes was placed. Eventually, the 1960 £5 note was never placed into general circulation and 10 to 12 weeks after the arrival of the notes in Cyprus, the Treasury ordered the entire supply of notes destroyed. As in the case of the of the 1957 £1 note, all known 1960 £5 notes today are the result of a few pulled out by members of the Board Committee who attended the burning of the notes. Altogether it is estimated that no more 15 of them exist today; most are almost never found in uncirculated condition.

The prefix of the 1960 £5 note was B/1 and it is unknown why that decision was made whilst in other denominations the prefix A remained constantly in use and, as in case of the £1 note, up to A/26. Some conclusions suggest that it was merely an error due to the rush in printing this issue.

The most interesting fact about the 1960 notes 250 mils and £5 is that they are an historical hybrid issue. Their designs remain unchanged, reflecting the colonial era, while their actual issue order was made by Cypriot officials, by which time Treasury affairs were transferred to the new officials of the future Republic.

From Jebel Tarik to Gibraltar

In 1995 the Gibraltar Government introduced a new series of banknotes dedicated to historical figures appearing on the reverse side of each note. The 5 pound note depicted Tarik Ibn Ziyad; his name is actually the source of the country's name – Gibraltar. In the background is the Moorish Castle.

Since the time of the Ancient Greeks and later on the Romans, Gibraltar Strait was referred to as the Pillars of Hercules, in Greek Hράκλειαι στῆλαι (Hērákleiai stêlai) and in Latin Columnae Herculis, which translates as 'Strait'. The inner part of the land was referred to by different names, mainly based on what is known today as the Rock of Gibraltar. It was during the Roman era that the place gained its Latin name Mons Calpe - Mount Calpe.

Following a raid in 710, a predominantly Muslim Berber army under the command of Tarik Ibn Ziyad (generally and commonly known as Moors) crossed from North Africa in April 711 and landed somewhere in the vicinity of Gibraltar (though most likely not in the bay or at the Rock itself). Tarik's expedition led to the Islamic conquest of Hispania (most of the Iberian Peninsula) which lasted for 800 years. (Hills, George (1974). Rock of Contention: A History of Gibraltar. London: Robert Hale & Company. p.13).

The rock was given the Arabic name, Jabal Ṭārik, (جَبُلُ طَارِق), meaning the Mountain of Tarik, replacing the Latin Mons Calpe. In 1462, after 150 years of wars with the Moors, the Crown of Castile seized power of the place, giving it the name Gibraltar, a derivation of the Arabic name Jabal Tārik. The British, who gained control following the Treaty of Utrecht of 1713, kept the Spanish name as it is known today.

Interestingly the British kept the Coat of Arms of Gibraltar unchanged, as it was first granted by a Royal Warrant passed in Toledo on 10 July 1502 by Isabella I of Castile. It is the oldest Coat of Arms in use in an overseas territory of the United Kingdom and is unique in that it is the only armorial insignia that dates from before the period of British colonial administration.

In 1836 the Latin name of Gibraltar was reused as the motto 'Montis Insignia Calpe' - Insignia of the Mountain of Calpe – and this was added to the COA in order to commemorate the British victory over Spain and France during their unsuccessful attempt to capture Gibraltar in what is known as the Great Siege of Gibraltar of 1779 - 1783.

In 2011 a new series of banknotes was introduced. The depiction of Tarik Ibn Ziyad was placed with the Moorish Castle as the main motif. The oldest parts of the Moorish Castle date back to the 11th century. The castle consisted of three wards rising from the area of what is today Grand Casemates Square to the Tower of Homage, which was rebuilt in the 14th century. Even today it dominates the Old City. The Upper Ward of the Castle and the Tower of Homage are featured on the reverse of the new £5 banknote.

THE 1914 EMERGENCY ISSUE

The 1914 emergency notes were in fact the first Gibraltar paper money to be issued. They were released into circulation on 6th August 1914. The notes are referred to as banknotes as they were officially declared such in 1914.

In the weeks leading up to the declaration of war, there was a monetary crisis in Gibraltar. People were hoarding money and taking it out of circulation due to the fear that the civilian population of Gibraltar was going to be evacuated. The demands for withdrawal of money exceeded the cash held in the banks.

In 1914 the currency of Gibraltar was a combination of sterling gold £1 and 10/- coins (the "sovereign" and "half-sovereign"), sterling silver and copper coins and Spanish silver and copper coins (the peseta at the time was worth 4p.) The Governor of Gibraltar, Sir Herbert Miles, asked the British Government for an emergency loan of £100,000 on 4th August in order to meet the sudden demand for cash. The loan would have allowed the Gibraltar Government to borrow money commercially. The request was turned down.

There was therefore only one alternative solution: to print money. The decision to issue Gibraltar banknotes was taken by the Governor on 5th August.

Proofs of the banknotes were submitted to the Governor that same evening and immediately approved for printing. Representatives of the Chamber of Commerce and the Exchange Committee of Merchants were summoned to The Convent that night and the situation explained to them by the Governor. 'Ordinance 10' of 1914 (The Bank Note Ordinance) was published later that evening as the Governor could create laws for Gibraltar without reference to any Gibraltar body. The first banknotes were supplied a mere few hours later by the printer to the Colonial Treasurer, A.C. Greenwood, and he had to sign - in original - each banknote that was going to be issued.

Everything was therefore ready from 10am on 6th August 1914 for the Anglo-Egyptian Bank and the Post Office Savings Bank to start issuing Gibraltar banknotes. It had been a terrific challenge to meet the deadline, but it was met. Gibraltar's greatest currency crisis ever was thus averted.

Two series were printed; in the haste of events the first was printed in black and white to resemble promissory notes and a few months later a second coloured series was printed with more advanced security features including the emblem of Gibraltar. Both series included the denominations of 2/-, 5/-, 10/-, £1, £5, £50.

- 3.4.7 If you receive any correspondence from the Expert Committee in relation to the Lot, including but not limited to a Certificate of Authenticity, you must provide us with copies of such correspondence no later than 7 days after you receive such correspondence.

4 AT THE SALE

4.1 Refusal of admission

Our sales usually take place on our own premises or premises over which we have control for the sale, and we have the right, exercisable at our complete discretion, to refuse admission to the premises or attendance at an auction.

Registration before bidding

Bidding as Principal

When making a bid (whether such bids are made in person or by way of telephone bids operated by Spink, commission or online or email bids), you will be deemed to be acting as principal and will be accepting personal liability, unless it has been agreed in writing, at the time of registration, that you are acting as agent on behalf of a third party buyer acceptable to us.

Commission Bids

If you give us instructions to bid on your behalf, by using the form provided in our catalogues or via our website, we shall use reasonable endeavours to do so, provided these instructions are received not later than 24 hours before the auction. VAT Refunds - Buyers from within the EU

- 5.3.4 VAT refunds are available on the Hammer Price and Buyer's Premium of Daggered (†) and Investment Gold (g) Lots. You must certify that you are registered for VAT in another EU country and that the Lot is to be removed from the United Kingdom within 3 months of the date of sale.
- 5.3.5 Where an EU buyer purchases a Lot on which import VAT has been charged, no refund of VAT is available from us. It may be possible to apply directly for a refund on form VAT 65 to HM Revenue & Customs Overeseas Repayment Section, Londonderry.

VAT Refunds - Buyers from outside the EU

- 5.3.6 Where a Lot is included within the Auctioneers' Margin Scheme and evidence of export from the EU is produced within 3 months of the date of sale, the VAT on Buyer's Premium may be refunded.
- 5.3.7 Where the Lot is marked as a Daggered (†) Lot the VAT charged on the Hammer Price may be refunded where evidence of export from the EU is produced within 3 months of the date of sale. A refund of VAT charged on the Buyer's Premium can also be made on receipt of proof of business as a collectibles dealer.
- 5.3.8 Where the Lot is marked as an Omega (Ω) Lot or an Import VAT (x) Lot and evidence of export from the EU is produced within 3 months of the date of sale, the VAT charged on both the Hammer Price and Buyer's Premium may be refunded. Where required, we can advise you on how to export such Lots as a specific form of export evidence is required. Where we advise you on the export of the Lots, please be aware that the ultimate responsibility in respect of obtaining a valid proof of export certificate will lie with you and we will not be responsible for your failure to obtain such certificate.
- 5.3.9 Lot marked as Investment Gold (g) is exempt from VAT on Hammer price. A refund of VAT charged on the Buyer's Premium can be made on receipt of proof of business as a collectibles dealer and where evidence of export from the EU is produced within 3 months of the date of sale

- Payment 5.4.1 You must provide us with your full name and permanent address and, if so requested, details of the bank from which any payments to us will be made. You must pay the full amount due (comprising the Hammer Price, the Buyer's Premium and any applicable VAT) within seven days after the date of the sale. This applies even if you wish to export the Lot and an export licence is (or may be) required.
- 5.4.2 You will not acquire title to the Lot until all amounts due have been paid in full. This includes instances where special arrangements were made for release of Lot prior to full settlement.

Collection of Purchases

Buyers will be required to pay for their lots when they wish to take possession of the same, which must be within 7 days of the date of the sale, unless prior arrangements have been made with Spink. Without prior agreement, lots will not be released until cleared funds are received with regard to payments made by

5.10 Remedies for non-payment or failure to collect purchases

- 5.12.5 If you request that we apply for an export licence on your behalf, we shall be entitled to recover from you our disbursements and out of pocket expenses in relation to such application, together with any relevant VAT.
- 5.12.6 We will not be obliged to rescind a sale nor to refund any interest or other expenses incurred by you where payment is made by you despite the fact that an export licence is required.

5.13 Refund in the case of Forgery

- 5.13.1 A sale will be cancelled, and the amount paid refunded to you if a Lot (other than a miscellaneous item not described in the catalogue) sold by us proves to have been a Forgery. - 5.13.1.4 you must provide to us all evidence obtained by you that a Lot is a Forgery no later than 7 days after you receive such evidence.
- 5.13.2 In no circumstances shall we be required to pay you any more than the amount paid by you for the Lot concerned and you shall have no claim for interest.
- 5.13.3 The benefit of this guarantee is not capable of being transferred, and is solely for the benefit of the person to whom the original invoice was made out by us in respect of the Lot when sold and who, since the sale, has remained the owner of the Lot without disposing of any interest in it to any third party.
- 5.13.4 We shall be entitled to rely on any scientific or other process to establish that the Lot is not a Forgery, whether or not such process was used or in use at the date of the auction.
